

**VILLA RENE LALIQUE  
WINGEN-SUR-MODER, FRANCE ▶**

Lalique lovers, prepare to be obsessed with this new five-star hotel

**A**t first glance, the former home of master glassmaker Rene Lalique looks like a charming Tudor-style villa, typical of the Alsace region of France where it was built in 1920. But to step inside is to witness the results of a massive renovation and the rebirth of the property as a luxury hotel, with interiors by Lady Tina Green and Pietro Mingarelli. The duo is responsible for the Lalique Maison furniture-and-accessory collection, and the six lavish suites are styled with art deco pieces from the line. Each room carries a distinct personality named after an iconic Rene Lalique creation — for example, the Dahlia has sleek, modern lines and crisp hues of beige and ivory. Swiss architect Mario Botta designed an adjacent glass structure, which houses the 40-seat restaurant presided over by Michelin-starred chef Jean-Georges Klein. Rooms start at \$390 per night.
